

Dear Friend of Jesus to Muslims: Many Muslims have made Europe and America their home. Indeed, the situation has raised many political, social, and spiritual dilemmas and questions. Here, we are addressing the spiritual issue first so we can share the Gospel with Muslims. Muslim neighbors love to talk about spiritual things. This allows us to share the Gospel

or give them a copy of the Bible, the New Testament, or our leaflets. Those who do reach Muslims often hear questions like the following, which I received a few weeks ago. The following is my response, presented here so that you, our supporter, may know how to respond.

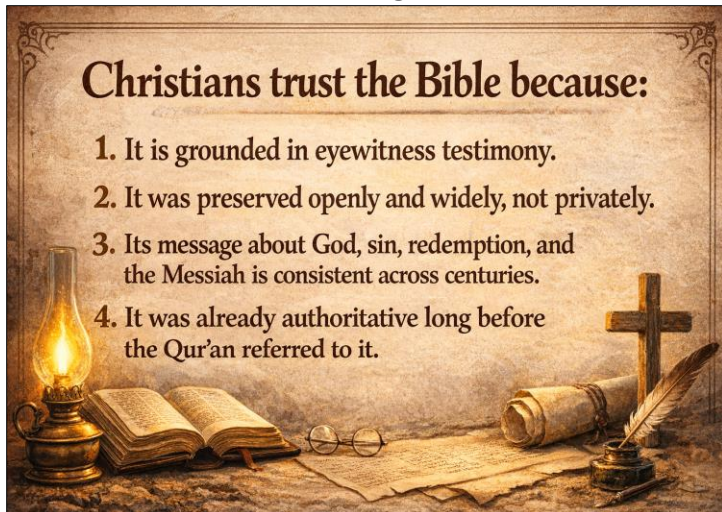
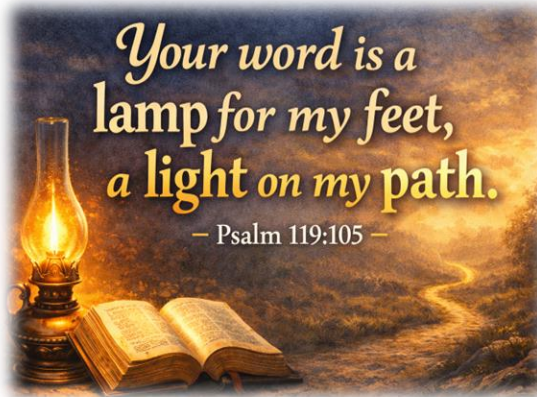
Question: “Why should a Muslim trust the Bible? The Qur’an speaks of belief in the Torah and the Injil, not the Bible. And why does the Bible contain so many books, including four Gospels?”

Response: You are correct that the Qur’an speaks of belief in the Torah (*Tawrat*) and the *Injil* (the Gospel). The key question, however, is: what were these Scriptures, and where are they found? The Bible is not a single book written by one person. It is a collection of books—just as the Qur’an itself refers to multiple earlier “Books” revealed before it (Sura 3:3-4; 5:46-48).

- The Torah corresponds to the books of Moses preserved within the Bible.
- The Injil refers to the Gospel—the message and work of Jesus the Messiah narrated by Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John.

You mention that the Bible has four Gospels. This is not a problem; it is a strength. The Gospel was not dictated to one man in a cave but was publicly testified to by multiple eyewitnesses, written independently, and preserved in the open. Four accounts do not mean four different messages—just as four witnesses to the same event do not produce four different truths.

The Qur’an never claims that God revealed only one Gospel book, nor does it name a lost *Injil* that existed separately from the known Gospel writings. Historically, in the 7th century, the only Gospel known, read, and circulated among Christians—from Arabia to Byzantium—was the Gospel narratives preserved in the New Testament.



If a Muslim trusts the Qur’an when it affirms the Torah and the Injil, then honesty requires asking: where are those scriptures today? The answer is historical and straightforward: they are found in the Bible Christians have always read, copied, taught, and died for.

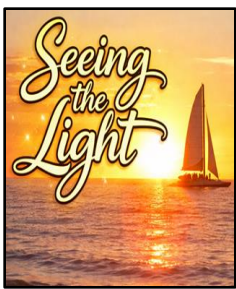
Christians trust the Bible because it is grounded in eyewitness testimony. It was openly and widely preserved, not privately. Its message about God, sin, redemption, and the Messiah is consistent across centuries. It was already authoritative long before the Qur’an referred to it. – **Steven and Karen Masood**

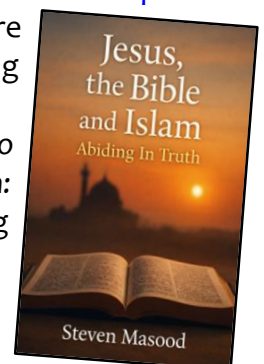
