DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. After the lame man's healing, who did the people of Lystra think the apostles were? What would you do if you came face to face with such exaltation and reverence from people?
2. What four things did James feel Gentile believers should abstain from?
3. Why was it important to deliver the Council's decree to brothers in Galatia?
4. What can we learn about God's grace in Acts 16? One minute, the jailer was a potential suicide, and the next minute, he was a child of God.

Points to ponder:

1. **Ridiculed, accused, arrested, flogged, and flung into a maximum-security prison in Philippi, Paul and Silas chose to pray and praise – and the heavens opened.**
2. **Because of your prayers, an entire family or neighborhood can be impacted and blessed.**
