3. Why did Paul want to appeal to Caesar?
4. Why do you think God chose Christian-hating Saul to become the famous evangelist, Paul?
5. What did Paul have to lose to gain salvation?
6. How did Paul use his situation to further the cause of Christ?
7. Why would Luke devote a long section of Acts to the description of a voyage and a shipwreck?
8. What can we learn about dealing with trials the way Paul handled his imprisonment?
9. Has the Book of Acts been a reminder of how to face the trials in your life? How will you press on despite them?

Imprisonment in Judea	58-60 AD	Acts 21:30 - 26:32
Voyage to Rome	60-61 AD	Acts 27:1 - 28:15
Imprisonment in Rome	61-63 AD	Acts 28:16-31
Post-Imprisonment Journeys	63-67 AD	after Acts

The table below lists the years in which Paul wrote his epistles. (Approximate Time)

Epistle	Year	When in Acts	Written from
1st Thessalonians	52 AD	Acts 18:11	from Corinth during second journey
2 nd Thessalonians	52 AD	Acts 18:11	from Corinth during second journey
Galatians	55-57 AD	Acts 19:10	during the third journey, probably from Ephesus
1 st Corinthians	57 AD	Acts 19:22	from Ephesus, during third journey
2 nd Corinthians	57 AD	Acts 20:1	from Macedonia, possibly at Philippi, during third journey
Romans	57-58 AD	Acts 20:2-3	from Corinth during third journey
Ephesians	62 AD	Acts 28:30	from Rome, while in prison in his own hired house
Philippians	62 AD	Acts 28:30	from Rome, while in prison in his own hired house
Colossians	62 AD	Acts 28:30	from Rome, while in prison in his own hired house
Philemon	63 AD	Acts 28:30	from Rome, while in prison in his own hired house
Hebrews	64-65 AD	after Acts	from Italy, while not in prison
Titus	64-65 AD	after Acts	while not in prison, from an unknown location
1 st Timothy	64-65 AD	after Acts	while not in prison, from an unknown location
2 nd Timothy	66-67 AD	after Acts	while in prison shortly before death, from Rome
